## PRESENT SITUATION

**1.9 million** orphans, Uganda

**1.2 million** orphans, Zambia

**2.3 million** orphans, Kenya



- Conditions of extreme poverty.
- Malnutrition and undernutrition causing disease, infections, and severe rickets.
- Mothers abandoned with several children.
- Stabilisation of the cost of food at the high prices reached in 2009
- Families eating just one meal a day in the evening to enable the children to go to sleep on a full stomach.
- Exclusion of vulnerable children from the school system.

## SCHOOLING

- School fees
- Books, exercise books, pencils
- Uniforms
- Midday meal: rice, beans, corn mash, bananas, milk, eggs
- Shoes
- Books for school libraries
- Workshops for manual professions
- Desks and tables, school roofs.

## HEALTH

- Distribution of food rations to 57 families: 12.5 kg of corn, 4.16 kg of beans, 8.33 kg of corn flour, 2 litres of oil per month for 4 people
- Psycho-social support for children
- Zambia: health and hygiene awareness program in 22 schools followed by 8 educative camps for groups of 24 young people: guidance towards alternative ways of living, understanding of AIDS/HIV, opportunities for earning a living.

## VARIOUS ACTIVITIES

- **Club "Child to child"**: this group has helped families and the community with two actions of tidying and cleaning the streets of the slum. An information and HIV prevention awareness program was given by the children to their contemporaries.
- **Saturday Club** : through activities such as dance, drama, films, debates, sport and games, youth workers assisted by voluntary workers teach the children skills to help them to face up to the difficulties that they are likely to meet in finding food, clothing and shelter.

**Project Evaluation**: all the institutions receiving subsidies provide an annual activity report and a financial report. Two field visits were made, one to Zambia, the other to Uganda and Kenya with the participation of the deputy mayor and two municipal councillors of a donor commune.
